SAMAKI PRMARY SCHOOL PROJECT

Samaki primary school situated approximately 120 Km from the city of Battambang serves villages in Tasen Commune, Kamrieng District. This is located close to the Thai border. As illustrated below the road to the area presents great challenges especially during rainy season.

The previous 3-roomed school that served 132 children was in very poor condition with major structural problems and a leaky roof. Although the Ministry of Education was aware of the problems they did not have the resources to fund the construction/repairs.

In 2017 visitors from Perth, including the Smiths, visited the old school. Dalkeith Rotary Club of Dalkeith, of which Dave Smith is a member, then generously provided funds for a bore to be drilled at the site, repair the toilets and provide water for the children to hand-wash in early 2018.

Late in 2018 the Smiths and friends visited again.
